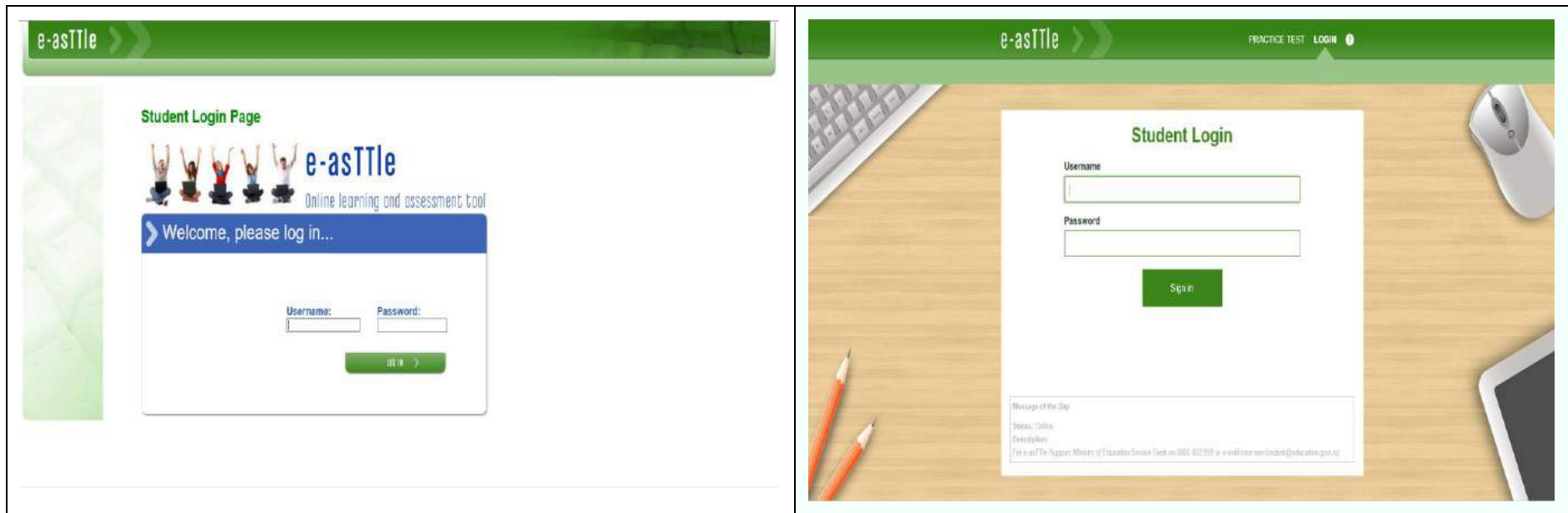


e-asTTle Test Player Comparison

The following pages compare the old student site and test player with the new site and player. The old Flash based version is shown on the left. The new HTML version is shown on the right.


1. Login


2. Test Selection Page

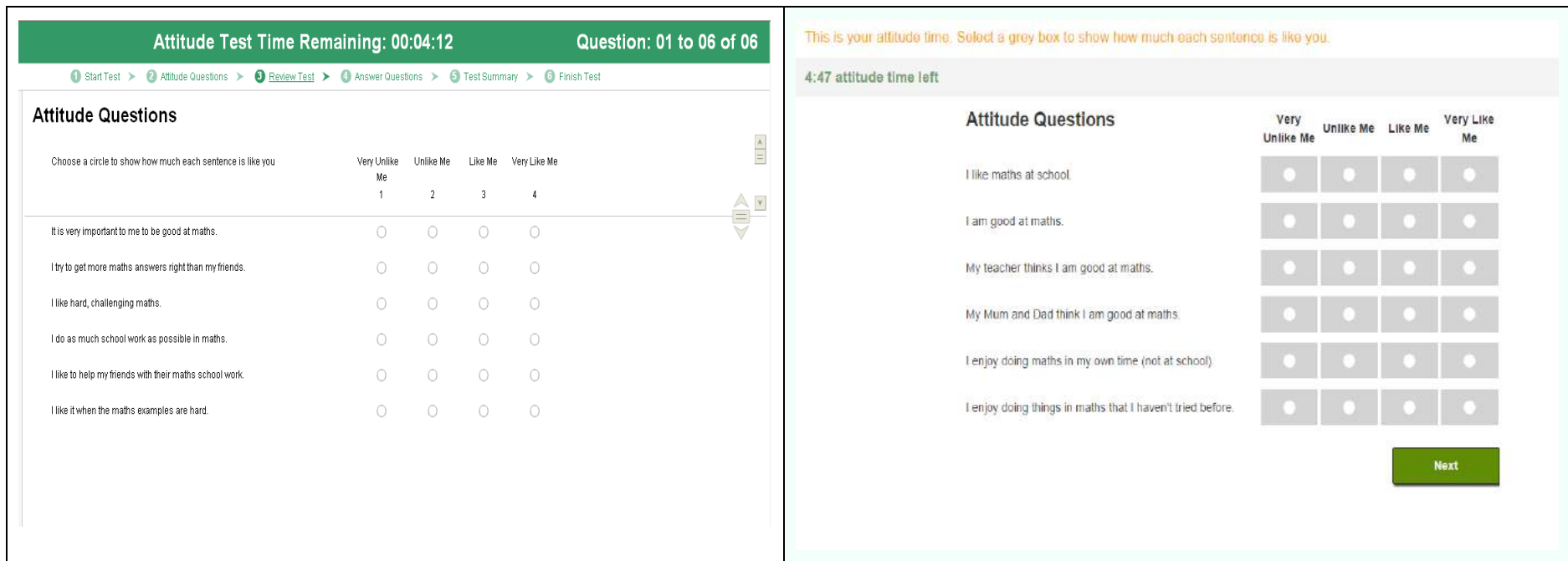
